Geography

- Know the names of at least 4 regions in the UK
- Know that Birmingham/Sheldon are in the West Midlands region (and locate on a map).
- Know the symbols for footpath, rail, place of worship, house and school on an OS map
- Know how land-use has changed over time (in Sheldon)

Geography fieldwork follow up: Identify symbols of local landmarks on an OS map Geography fieldwork follow up: Make an overlay map with how land-use has changed over time

Art

- Know how to create a background using a wash
- Know how to use a range of brushes to create different effects in painting
- Know that Mohammed Ali creates religious street art in Birmingham

Skill Progression

Geography

- I can locate and label East Midlands, West Midlands, London, South East the South West regions on a map
- I can use OS map symbols on Digi Map to locate landmarks to plan a route
- I can draw a sketch map of the local using OS map symbols
- I can read and plot 4-figure grid references
- I can show the changes in land-use on a map (overlay map with tracing paper)

Art Artistic Elements: Line and Colour

- I can choose an appropriately sized brush independently
- I can use a stencil to paint using 'dabbing'
- I can create a colour wash by experimenting with different paints & washes
- I can choose which paint technique to use

Teach Computing Branching databases Computing J2data Branch and Pictogram Computing Project: Geography/Maths - Create a branching database to sort between OS map symbols

- I can create questions to sort objects based around yes/no answers
- I can select an attribute to separate objects into groups
- I can select objects to arrange into a branching database based upon answers to yes/no questions
- I can check that my branching database works
- I can compare the structure of two branching databases and comment upon their effectiveness
- I can use a branching database to answer questions
- I can explain what a pictogram/branching database tells me and compare their ways of presenting information

	Geography fieldwork
Question	Does the local area have enough recreation facilities?
Prior work	Look at maps and locate the recreation facilities to help form the questionnaire. Map the route being taken and make a sketch map to include OS symbols for the following footpath, school, place of worship, house, rail (farm, airport)
Data collection	Questionnaire in the form of a tally chart Which is favourite place to visit? (give a list to choose from) What facilities are lacking? Is there enough green space? Are there enough transport links so people can enjoy the facilities?
Data presentation	Present data using bar charts
Skill from LTP	I can use OS map symbols on digi map to locate landmarks to plan a route and sketch these landmarks during fieldwork
Oracy	Children to make a short video and present findings
